MINUTES of REGULAR MEETING of the BOARD of COMMISSIONERS of the CITY of BOWLING GREEN, KENTUCKY held MAY 3, 2016

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Bowling Green, Kentucky met in regular session in the Commission Chamber of City Hall, Bowling Green, Kentucky at 4:30 p.m. on May 3, 2016. Mayor Bruce Wilkerson called the meeting to order. An invocation was given by Senior Pastor Adam Shourds of Broadway United Methodist Church, and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Assistant City Manager/City Clerk Katie Schaller-Ward called the roll, and the following members were present: Commissioner Sue Parrigin, Commissioner Rick Williams, Commissioner Joe W. Denning, Commissioner Melinda M. Hill and Mayor Bruce Wilkerson. Absent: none. There was a full quorum of the Board of Commissioners.

AWARDS & RECOGNITIONS

Mayor Wilkerson announced the retirements of Advanced Communications Dispatcher Sue Ellen Lindsey with 20 years of service and Firefighter/EMT II James Rhoades with 21 years of service.

Commissioner Williams recognized Greg Brown, Jeff Bullock and Kenneth Willoughby who help save another man's life following a car accident.

Operation P.R.I.D.E. Executive Director Angie Alexieff presented P.R.I.D.E.'s April residential award to Heather Patterson for improvements made to 928 Josephine Street, and the commercial award to Commonwealth Health Corporation and Tomorrow's Woman for improvements made at 1623 Scottsville Road.

RIVERFRONT AREA PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS PRESENTATION

At the request of the City Manager, Neighborhood and Community Services Director Brent Childers and Parks and Recreation Director Brent Belcher provided an overview of a proposed plan to make improvements to the riverfront area from RiverWalk Park to Weldon Peete Park through a multi-phased approach. Mr. Childers explained the need to make improvements to an existing boat ramp for public safety purposes and the ability to apply for a 50/50 grant through the Land and Water Conservation Fund Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership Program to assist with the cost for the first phase of development which was estimated at about \$1.5 million. Mr. Belcher described some of the

elements to be included in Phase 1 of the proposed improvement plan, such as a new boat ramp, urban fishing piers, greenways trail connection of the two parks, disc golf course and other habitat and infrastructure improvements.
