MINUTES of REGULAR MEETING of the BOARD of COMMISSIONERS of the CITY of BOWLING GREEN, KENTUCKY held MAY 17, 2016

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Bowling Green, Kentucky met in regular session in the Commission Chamber of City Hall, Bowling Green, Kentucky at 4:30 p.m. on May 17, 2016. Mayor Bruce Wilkerson called the meeting to order. An invocation was given by Martha Christian with Broadway United Methodist Church, and all present recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Assistant City Manager/City Clerk Katie Schaller-Ward called the roll, and the following members were present: Commissioner Rick Williams, Commissioner Joe W. Denning, Commissioner Melinda M. Hill, Commissioner Sue Parrigin and Mayor Bruce Wilkerson. Absent: none. There was a full quorum of the Board of Commissioners.

CITY MANAGER

City Manager Kevin D. DeFebbo requested a closed session for the purpose of discussion of proposed litigation against the City. Motion was made by Hill and seconded by Parrigin to convene in closed session following the regular meeting pursuant to KRS 61.810 (1) (c). Mayor Wilkerson called for roll call vote.

Minutes of Regular Meeting May 3, 2016

Minutes of the above-referenced meeting were distributed to the Board of Commissioners with the Agenda for their review. Motion was made by Hill and seconded by Williams to approve said minutes as written. Mayor Wilkerson asked for discussion, and with none, a roll call vote was taken.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Brian Howard, president of the Cedar Ridge Neighborhood Association, requested a public hearing to allow residents to voice their concerns about the closing of Robinson Avenue by CSX Railroad. He said the neighborhood was not made aware of this issue until they read about it in the newspaper and then received a letter from the City. Mr. Howard expressed concern about the circulation of misinformation and felt a public hearing would be beneficial. Mayor Wilkerson apologized for not participating in a discussion with the neighborhood prior to the Board taking action. He explained that since the railroad was established before Robinson Avenue was built, CSX had the ability to revoke access to its right-of-way. With support from the Commissioners, the Mayor agreed to set aside time at the end of the June 7th Board of Commissioners meeting to discuss this issue. He

cautioned that the residents should not expect this discussion to change the outcome, but would allow for the sharing of valid details.

Nathan Morguelan spoke in favor of a fairness ordinance. In referencing to the Pledge of Allegiance, he emphasized the Board of Commissioners should take into consideration its last phrase, "liberty and justice for all." He identified other Kentucky cities which have already acted on this issue, and urged the Board to listen to and support the over 1,000 local petitioners and 100 local businesses who have voiced their support. Mr. Morguelan said if everyone worked together, it could help grow Bowling Green.

City Attorney Gene Harmon explained the agreement was necessary for DRA to be able to offer alcohol sales during the evening concerts at Circus Square Park. PRESENTATION OF CITY MANAGER BUDGET RECOMMENDATION

City Manager Kevin DeFebbo provided an overview of the recommended Fiscal Year 2016/2017 Annual Operating Budget. He stated this was the 14th year with no tax increase recommended. He also highlighted some of the key components of the budget recommendation, such as increasing the fund balance level from 20% to 25% and proposing \$15.1 million in capital projects, with an increase in spending for road paving, sidewalks and park projects.

Chief Financial Officer Jeff Meisel outlined the FY2017 revenue projections, which were developed using a conservative approach, for All Funds in the total amount of \$110,997,906, and specifically for the General Fund in the total amount of \$65,073,000. Assistant City Manager/City Clerk Katie Schaller-Ward provided a summary of the proposed expenditure recommendations for All Funds totaling \$115,252,648 and indicated about \$4.3 million of previously saved money would be used for specific capital improvement projects and anticipated increases in the Health Care Fund. She also reported the total proposed General Fund expenditure budget was \$65,073,000 and included several capital improvement projects as well as agency funding recommendations. Ms. Schaller-Ward stated the General Fund operating budget excluding capital improvements was only up by 2.6% over the FY2016 adopted operating budget, and personnel costs made up nearly all of that amount. Assistant Chief Financial Officer Erin Ballou presented the change in debt service requirements for FY2017 and proposed new fund balance level. Human Resources Director Michael Grubbs summarized the recommendations related to personnel and the capital improvement program included in the FY2017 budget proposal.

Ms. Schaller-Ward responded to questions regarding agency funding and confirmed a separate action of the Board would be required to officially allocate funds to each contract agency. Following the discussion, Ms. Schaller-Ward stated the first reading of an Ordinance adopting the FY2017 budget would be included on the agenda for the next Board meeting along with several other budget related items.

CLOSED SESSION

Following a brief recess to clear the Commission Chamber, the Board of Commissioners met at approximately 6:20 p.m. in closed session pursuant to KRS 61.810 (1) (c) as previously approved. Mr. DeFebbo confirmed no action was expected to follow the discussion.

ADJOURNMENT

Once all discussion concluded in closed session and there being no further business to come before the Board of Commissioners, at approximately 7:10 p.m., Mayor Wilkerson declared this meeting adjourned.
